





### **EUROPEAN CULTURAL HERITAGE SUMMIT 2024**

The European Cultural Heritage Summit 2024, the annual 'rendez-vous' for cultural heritage stakeholders in Europe, is taking place from 6 to 8 October in Bucharest. The Summit will provide a new and fitting opportunity to promote the political, environmental, and societal value of cultural heritage for Europe. Organised by Europa Nostra and co-funded by the Creative Europe Programme of the European Union, the Summit is held under the High Patronage of the President of Romania, H.E. Klaus Iohannis.

We are delighted to host the European Cultural Heritage Summit in Romania for the first time, given the country's outstanding commitment and creativity in protecting and promoting our shared heritage. This year, the remarkable rehabilitation projects of the <u>Saxon Church in Alma Vii in Transylvania</u> and <u>St. Michael's Church in Cluj-Napoca</u> are among the exemplary <u>winners of the European Heritage Awards / Europa Nostra Awards 2024</u>.

We look forward to celebrating the 26 winners coming from all over Europe at the <u>European Heritage</u> <u>Awards Ceremony</u>, to be held at the iconic Romanian Athenaeum. Attendees will also have the opportunity to hear first-hand from all the winners during the <u>European Heritage Excellence Day</u>, showcasing the very best heritage practices from across Europe.

Quality will also be a central theme at this year's <u>European Heritage Policy Agora</u>. Heritage professionals, representatives of civil society organisations, academic researchers and policy-makers will come together to discuss the concept of quality, which ought to be a driving force behind policy strategies and specific interventions related to heritage, with an emphasis on finding adequate responses to the climate crisis, including adaptation, mitigation and risk preparedness, and investing in adequate capacity building.

With a keen eye on rapid technological developments, especially with regard to AI, the second <u>European Heritage Hub Forum</u>, organised by the Europeana Foundation, will focus on cultural heritage and the digital transformation of our society. With many opportunities and some challenges on the horizon, we will explore how we can make the most of digital technologies to further enhance our joint commitment to safeguarding our shared heritage and to transmitting it to new generations.

Two partner events will be held on the eve of the Summit, namely a Round Table Discussion: Expectations of Romanian Cultural Heritage Civil Society from Public Authorities and Government (*in Romanian only*), which will culminate with the presentation of A Manifesto for Cultural Heritage in Romania; and a Youth Forum, organised by ESACH in partnership with Europa Nostra in the frame of our network project European Cultural Heritage Agora co-funded by the EU Creative Europe Programme.

The Bucharest Summit is organised in close cooperation with the Ministry of Culture of Romania, the City of Bucharest, the Romanian Order of Architects, Pro Patrimonio Foundation, Monumentum Association, Association ARA – Architecture. Restoration. Archaeology, ARCHÉ Association, and other cultural heritage organisations and partners, both public and private.



#### EUROPEAN HERITAGE HUB FORUM

"Championing a responsible digital transition for and with cultural heritage" 10:30 – 16:00 EEST

The Hub Forum is organised by the <u>Europeana Foundation</u> in the frame of the EU-funded <u>European</u> <u>Heritage Hub</u> pilot project and in close partnership with the Hub consortium led by Europa Nostra.

Building on the outcomes of the <u>first European Heritage Hub Forum held in 2023 in Venice</u>, which explored the role and impact of cultural heritage in Europe's green transformation, this second Forum will delve into the challenges and opportunities presented by digital transition. It will explore how the cultural heritage sector can and is already embracing a socially and environmentally responsible digital transition and how it can support and inspire Europe's digital future. Its outcomes will set the stage for the third Hub Forum in 2025, which will focus on the social dimension of the sector's triple transformation.

Discussions will address the urgent need for human-centred and value-based uses of Artificial Intelligence with regard to cultural heritage. The European Heritage Hub Forum will also highlight the vital interaction between the digital dimension of heritage preservation and the positive role of heritage for the social and environmental transformation of our society and economy.

The Hub Forum will serve as a platform for the European Heritage Hub community to discuss timely and forward-looking topics concerning the digital transformation of the heritage sector. It will consist of two interlinked components:

- Policy conversations will bring together policy-makers at all levels, experts, and professionals to assess the digital transformation of the cultural heritage sector, with a specific focus on its social and environmental impacts. These discussions will pinpoint key challenges and opportunities, showcase best practices and explore forward-looking themes related to heritage digitisation in Europe. The outcome will be a Call to Action stressing the significance of a socially and environmentally responsible digital transformation in the heritage sector and its role in shaping Europe's (digital) future.
- An interactive exploration and fair will showcase a diverse array of projects, initiatives, and best practices that harness digital technologies to enhance sustainability, inclusion, and diversity in the heritage sector. This component will stimulate the networking, cooperation and knowledge-sharing of the European Heritage Community of Practice, Community of Interest, Hub partners and all Forum participants in an inspiring and interactive setting.

The <u>winners of the European Heritage Awards / Europa Nostra Awards 2024</u> will be celebrated at a high-profile event co-hosted by **Iliana Ivanova**, European Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth, and Prof. Dr. **Hermann Parzinger**, Executive President of Europa Nostra. During the Ceremony, the Grand Prix laureates and the Public Choice Award winner, chosen from among this year's winners and entitled to receive €10,000 each, will be announced.

The European Heritage Awards Ceremony will be held at the Romanian Athenaeum, the most prestigious concert hall in Bucharest, which recently received a <u>European Heritage Label</u> in recognition of its European significance. The Ceremony will be attended by Prof. Dr. **Sergiu Nistor**, Presidential Adviser, **Raluca Turcan**, Minister of Culture of Romania, and Dr. **Nicusor Dan**, Mayor of Bucharest.

The Ceremony, jointly organised by Europa Nostra and the European Commission, will include live performances by the Romanian symphonic ensemble <u>Violoncellissimo</u>, led by Professor **Marin Cazacu**.

"Upholding Quality Principles in Heritage Conservation" 15:00 – 19:00 EEST

This edition of the European Heritage Policy Agora will focus on drawing links between flagship EU policies, such as the Green Deal and the <u>New European Bauhaus</u>, and key heritage conservation documents, such as the <u>European Quality Principles</u>, developed by ICOMOS on European Commission's request, and the <u>Davos Baukultur Quality System</u>, emanating from the <u>2018 Davos Declaration</u>.

The dialogue will emphasise the importance of quality in cultural heritage restoration and preservation, explore ways to make policy and practice more interconnected, and identify gaps for action. The event will provide an opportunity to discuss priorities in cultural heritage management ahead of the formation of the new European Commission.

#### By Taxi





### **EUROPA NOSTRA**





### **VISUAL IDENTITY**




The visual identity of the European Cultural Heritage Summit 2024 emphasises the idea that **cultural heritage acts as a stabilising and harmonising force** amidst turbulence, confusion and lack of identifiable principles.

The shape of the logo specifically refers to the cultural heritage of the host city of Bucharest and of Romania in general. The distribution of elements repeats geometric structures found in **Romanian** modernist architecture and thus symbolically demonstrates how our present and future creations can thrive on patterns of that heritage.

A noticeable human head - in which one can identify the expression of iconic works by the famous Romanian sculptor **Constantin Brâncuşi**, in particular "Mademoiselle Pogany" or "Muse" - represents the humane measure and human origin of culture as well as people's responsibility within the scope of cultural heritage. The figure stays in a dynamic state of balance: fairly stable yet vulnerable to threats.

Some subtle afterimages of the golden ratio or Fibonacci spiral allude to the longing of harmony, while the palettes of blues and reds mark associations with the European Union and Europa Nostra respectively.


